Ward Lumber to host Hog Harvest Seminar

Jay, NY. – Ward Lumber is hosting a Hog Harvest Seminar for anyone who is interested in learning to harvest their own swine.

The seminar is being held on Saturday, October 27 from 8:00am to 5:00pm at Ward Lumber in Jay. This seminar will demonstrate to the small farm a home-style hog slaughter and dressing. Hands-on opportunities are limited. Topics include: preparation, equipment and set up, shot and stick, hang and bleed, skin and gut, splitting the halves, halving the pig and readying the carcass to cool, primal cuts and finish products, wrap for freezer, recipes, using the whole pig, trouble shooting.



The presenter is Courtney Grimes-Sutton, who is a young farmer and a butcher who can help you approach the feat of getting a hog into your freezer. Courtney got into farming by growing and marketing vegetables with friends in the Hudson Valley for a few years in her early twenties. She apprenticed with a blacksmith, went to industrial welding school, and moved north to Essex Farm to test the waters of farming with draft horses. She was the butcher at Essex Farm for three and a half years, and has moved on to her own family farm in Keeseville with her partner, Asa Thomas-Train, and friends & family.

Register by October 6, and the cost is \$20 per person. After October 6, the cost is \$30 per person. Space is limited, and pre-registration required. Lunch is included, using all local farm ingredients.
